

EGG CONTAINER – 10.07.2009

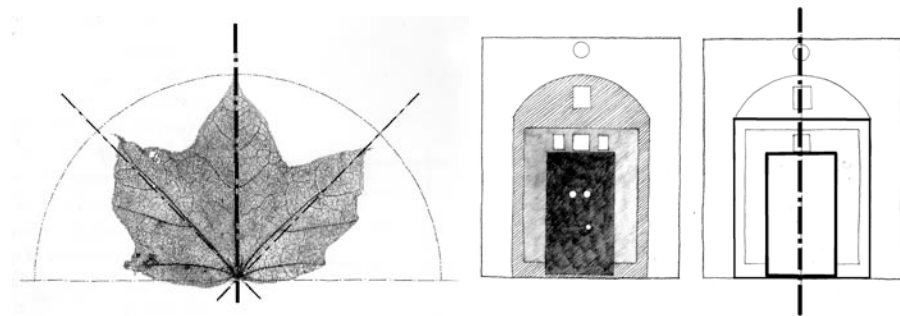
Part 1: Complete the following in class:

Assess your classmates' egg containers and assign each one a term (or a few terms) that you previously illustrated (terms from the reading and from Rittenhouse are valid).

The term(s) you assign must describe the containers' spatial organization and three-dimensional composition ideas.

Part 2: Consider the term(s) assigned to your egg container in class. Complete a page of four drawings as an entry in your Illustrated Dictionary that *graphically describes* how these terms and the organizational / compositional concepts they imply relate to your design*.

The drawings you make should be *analytical*. An analytical drawing – or a diagram – is a drawing which uses simple lines, a few lines weights, and differing line types (center line, dashed line, dotted line) to illustrate a spatial condition.



* You may make minor adjustments to your design in these four drawings to make the relationship of your container to the word more clear.
